Frederick Fly Flips Out: Franny is 10 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 8 years old.

Franny Fly and the Blues Rock Battle: Franny is 11 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 8 years old.

There's No Such Thing as a Perfect Fly: Franny is 11 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore turn 9 years old.

Fiona Fly and the Great American Bake-Off: Franny is 11 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 9 years old.

Franny's First Dance: Franny is 12 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 9 years old.

Fillmore Fly and the No-Fun Flu: Franny is 12 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 10 years old.

The Mystery at Black Rock Beach: Franny is 12 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 10 years old.

Frances Feeds the Homeless: Franny is 12 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 10 years old.

Fonzy Fly: Lights, Camera, Action!: Franny is 13 years old; twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 10 years old.

Frankie and Fawny and the Deep-Sea Pearl: Franny is 13 years old; Twins Fonzy and Fillmore are 11 years old.

Franny: 10, 10, 11, 11, 11, 12, 12, 12, 12, 13, 13 (book number 11 is highlighted and Franny should be 13 in that book...that will be the sequel to Black Rock. Twins Fonzy and Fillmore will be 11 in that book.); **Franny ages from 10-13 throughout the series or fifth grade through eighth grade throughout the series.**

Twins Fonzy and Fillmore: 8, 8, 8, 9, 9, 9, 10, 10, 10, 10, 11 (book number 11 is highlighted and twins Fonzy and Fillmore should be 11 in that book...that will be the sequel to Black Rock); **Twins Fonzy and Fillmore age from 8-11 throughout the series or third grade through sixth grade throughout the series.**

Frederick and Fiona's ages are not mentioned in the series. Neither is Mr. or Mrs. Feldman who live next door or their dog Frances the Foodle. Finny Feldman is the same age as Fonzy and Fillmore in each book in the series.
