## Comprehension Questions for Chapters 1-4

1. Describe the setting of chapter 1.

Chapter 1 takes place in Palm Springs, California inside the Feldman household. Mr. Feldman has just received a devastating phone call. Mrs. Feldman's sister (Finny's Aunt Friday) has passed away unexpectedly.

2. In chapter 1, what does the grandfather clock represent?

3. What was the cause of Aunt Fraidy's death?

4. In chapter 1, how does Mrs. Feldman react to the news of her sister's passing?
